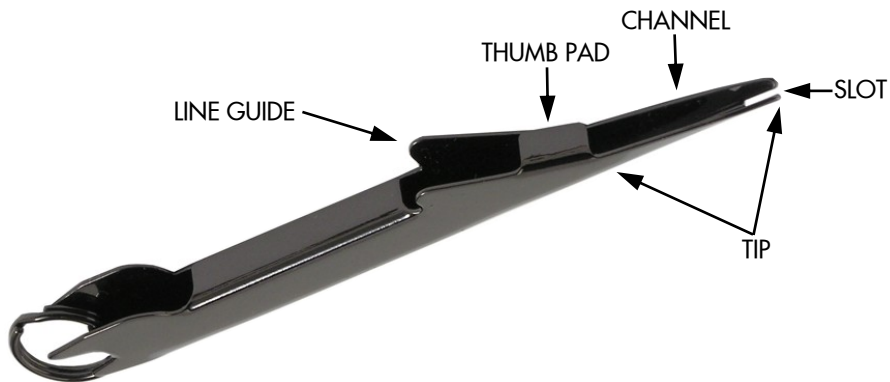


TEMPLE FORK OUTFITTERS KNOT TOOL

The Nail Knot allows for the line/leader knot to easily pass through the rod guides and it is an effective way to tie any size monofilament to your fly line, providing a smooth and secure knot that grips more as it gets tighter.

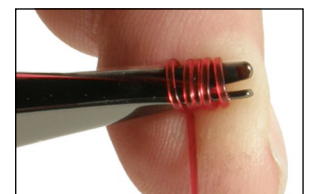


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Nail Knot

Use Nail Knot to attach backing to fly line or leader to fly line using the following method.

1. Place the knot tool in the palm of either hand and grasp the tool with the fingers, placing the thumb on top of the tool THUMB PAD, keeping the TIP & SLOT of the tool exposed.
2. Place leader butt between GUIDE through CHANNEL and TIP & SLOT so that leader butt material extends approximately 6 inches beyond TIP & SLOT. Use thumb to secure line over PAD.
3. Pull leader butt material downward into SLOT and wrap a tight coil of 4-5 turns. Wrap back around Knot Tool TIP towards thumb using forefinger to hold turns in place.
4. From the thumb side, thread end of leader butt material back into CHANNEL under all turns and out through slotted TIP.



5. Insert fly line from SLOT end of Knot Tool through wraps. Give 'tag end' a light jerk towards SLOT end of tool, this causes the knot to slide off Knot Tool onto fly line. Inspect and adjust wraps before securing knot completely. Tighten knot to secure to fly line, trim off excess material.
